



Braille & Tactile

Braille signs are no longer only found at hotels, offices and hospitals. If your facility has a snack area, a gift shop, waiting rooms, a fitness center, mail rooms or even a room for coats, the ADA law specifies that you must install a tactile Braille sign.

Building codes now have requirements for certain signage to include information in an embossed (tactile) form & also in Braille. The codes also provide specifications for how Braille & Tactile signs are to be made, as well as where they should be placed for ease of use.

These signs meet Australian Standards: AS2899.1 – 1986, AS 1428.4 – 1992
